

Childcare Data Report for

29644

The Need:

Greenville County is a community of 35,700 children ages 0-5 (Annie E Casey), with nearly 16,000 children living in poverty (Census), and is experiencing a childcare crisis.

Greenville County has 216 registered childcare providers, including 47 faith-based programs, 60 home-based childcare providers, 100 nonprofit and for-profit childcare facilities, and 9 government-based providers with a total county-wide capacity of 24,000 children. Greenville County is projected to experience a population growth of 220,000 additional residents by 2045, including a projected additional 15,000 children ages 0-5.

Based on childcare usage projections, Greenville First Steps and SEARCHlight project an additional 8,000 childcare slots need to be added by 2040 to keep up with projected growth. Full-day, week-long care is particularly needed for children aged 6 weeks to 24 months.

The Opportunity:

As a component of the strategies to address Greenville County needs, a coalition of community leaders including SEARCHlight, Greenville First Steps, United Way of Greenville County, and Greenville Chamber of Commerce proposes developing a cohort of new church-based sites to offer infant, toddler, and childcare throughout or community.

Benefits of faith-based childcare:

- Offering safe, affordable, accessible childcare for church and neighborhood families to ensure families can return to work.
- Increase exposure of your services within the community 70% of faith-based childcare providers report that families who participate in childcare are more likely to participate in other church-based activities.
- Build connections between families served in childcare and other church services Existing churches that offer weekday childcare report an increase in the size of the congregation after opening childcare.

"At first, our center was only serving church-based families, but as the program grew, we found more and more families joining the church because of the relationships that were being built through the center."


