


THREE MOST RELIABLE PREDICTORS OF EARLY SCHOOL SUCCESS

- 3. Access to safe, reliable quality childcare


BENEFITS OF CHILDCARE

GREENVILLE COUNTY CHILDCARE DESERTS



GOAL: By 2040, 4,250 additional childcare slots in Greenville County

50 new home-based childcare providers	250 children
10 new church based childcare providers	1,000 children
50 childcare providers increase capacity by 25%	1,500 children
10 new for-profit childcare providers	1,000 children
10 employers offer onsite childcare	500 children

OPTION I: OPENING CHILDCARE ON CHURCH SITE

Options:

I.Run in-house with church staff2.Lease to an established childcare provider3.Contract with SHARE Head Start

OPTION I: OPENING CHILDCARE ON CHURCH SITE

- Benefits of church-based on-site childcare:
 - I. Help serve the existing church community
 - 2. Help to expand the reach of the church into the neighboring community
 - 3. Provide Christian education during formative years
 - 4. Strengthen relationships with childcare families and church community
 - 5. Help families return to work by employing them in the center

OPTION 2: EXPANDING EXISTING ON-SITE CHILDCARE

- I. Is the site at capacity?
- 2. Is the site offering Infant/Toddler care?
- 3. Is the site operating M-F 6 am-6 pm?
- 4. Could the site offer third-shift services?
- 5. Could the site offer subsidized care
 - (DSS Scholarships, SC First Steps 4k)

OPTION 3: CONTRIBUTE TO CHILDCARE LOAN FUND

- To launch April 2024
- Churches and Nonprofits can request a 0% loan for one-time start-up costs (e.g., facility needs, playground, equipment, materials)
- Funds will be awarded based on "projected to serve" and capacity
- Entity will repay 0% loans
- When enrollment benchmarks are hit, payments may be "forgiven" https://www.GreenvilleFirstSteps.org/donate



OPTION 4: PROVIDE MENTORS FOR NEW SITES

Childcare directors and owners will assist new sites:

- Developing business plan
- Making contact with CCR&R and DSS
- Pre-visit consultation
- Help develop registration forms
- Help develop recruitment efforts
- Assist with Lease options
